### Challenges:

The school has still faced with the following challenges: -

- Buying enough land for the school.
- Constructing classrooms, staff quarters, offices and bathrooms.
- Inadequate scholastic materials for both learners and teaching curriculum aids.
- Lack of water source to facilitate education of learners.
- Constructing kitchen and procurement of kitchen utensils.
- Procurement of the following: school van, sign posts, playing equipments etc to be used at school.

- Inadequate feeding of learners since prices for food substances are skyrocketing on daily basis.
- Insufficient staffing and staff houses.
- Insufficient furniture.
- Inadequate pit latrines for both teachers and learners.

#### **Future Plans:**

The General Executive Board of **St. Charles Nursery & Primary School** has laid 2024 plans in order to develop the **spiritual lives, economically, physically, socially, academically and healthy** of the children of **St. Charles Nursery & Primary School-Akibui**.

The Board has agreed to do the following: -

- Procurement of enough land for school will accommodate both Nursery section, Primary section classrooms, playing grounds, dormitories, dining hall, teachers' quarters and Orphanage Centre for young children.
- Procurement of school vans to ease out transportation challenge faced by learners and teaching staff.
- Building a good permanent structures i.e. classrooms, teachers' houses.
- To give equal standard education to all children e.g. orphans and needy.
- To purchase enough scholastic materials and co-curriculum activities to realize good performance of learners right from Nursery and Primary Sections.
- To mobilize more children to raise school enrolment from nursery up to primary level in different places in Teso Sub region.
- To feed the children breakfast, lunches and supper.
- To lobby support from inner members and outside members, parents, friends, supportive members or organizations (NGOs) from all nations and government.
- To register the school from local government up to National level in Uganda.
- Procurement of kitchen equipments and office equipments etc.
- Transfer of the school to its own land allocated for.
  - Lobby for construction of more classrooms and staff houses.
  - Fencing the school to avoid land encroachers and trespassing.
  - Construction of staff pit latrines and learners.
  - Procurement of more school land for easy expansion.
